Position Purpose

The purpose of this position is to investigate, report on and take appropriate action regarding the range of Environment, Health, Development and compliance matters associated with the Division, including:

- Regulated premises inspection program
- On-site sewage management inspections and approvals
- Swimming pool barrier inspection program
- Underground Petroleum Storage System inspection program
- Environmental and Health related incident and complaint investigations
- Environmental and Health related technical advice to internal and external stakeholders

The staff member can expect to undertake other duties in addition to those described in this document. Knowledge & Experience

Demonstrated capability, typically 3-5 years in the following areas:

- Conducting regulatory inspections of and providing approval to operate on the range of Environmental and Public Health programs administered by Council
- Identifying, analysing and resolving problems including negotiation around contentious compliance matters, implementing effective communication strategies and conflict resolution with a range of customers
- Carrying out enforcement action including undertaking investigations, evidence gathering, issuing of infringements,
 Orders and Directions and representing Council in the Local Court and Land and Environment Court as an expert witness or as part of a prosecution
- Applying industry legislation, codes and standards within a local government environment including contaminated site assessment and environment and health regulation.
- Preparing and coordinating policy development in relation to public health and environmental matters regulated by Council
- Providing specialist technical advice to the Development assessment team and external stakeholders on the range of Environmental and Public Health programs administered by Council
